



Our Guest Preacher: Chuck Thompson, his wife Barb, and their three children, CJ, Sarah, and Erin, came to Bristol and First Presbyterian Church 28 years ago. Chuck is a Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist in private practice. He is also the Director of Counseling, an Associate Professor of Psychology, and an Adjunct Professor of Religion at King University. Chuck has written four applied theology books, a novel based on the Epistle of James, seven mystery novels set in Bristol, and two Appalachian fantasy series.

Music Notes: Today's anthem, "A New Commandment," is a setting of the scripture from the Gospel of John 13:34. The music was composed by noted English Renaissance composer Thomas Tallis (c. 1505–1585). Tallis served as a court musician for four English monarchs during a

turbulent time when policies regarding religion and authority were shifting. His length of service is a testimony to two things: his creative talent and his adaptability. Probably best known for his amazing 40-part motet, *Spem in Alium*, Tallis also proved himself very able at composing the smaller anthems, as today's musical selection demonstrates.

Organist's Footnotes: Today's prelude is based on Hymn 529 in *Glory to God*, "Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether." This communion text calls attention to the inherent sacramental nature of all meals and the communal dimensions of all human interaction. The tune, UNION SEMINARY, originally composed for an anthem setting of this text, honors the institution where the composer was trained and later taught. James Biery (b. 1956) has arranged an interesting, quiet setting for organ, with the melody echoed in canon one beat later, and a fifth lower in pitch.

A former choir member of mine would have called today's postlude a "green and red light special," referring to the lights on the organ that warn the organist that the crescendo pedal and full organ (sforzando) are both engaged. Rebecca Groom te Velde's (b. 1956) arrangement of LLANFAIR is both loud and fast, as most toccatas are. But to her credit, te Velde changes her patterns almost every measure, making her arrangement more challenging for the performer and, I hope, more interesting for the listener.
